## DAY LIGHT SAVINGS SUNDAY 16 MARCH

With the end of daylight saving due to be implemented on Sunday 16 March it is timely to remind you of our local policy in this regard, for those late night traders.

**Licensed premises will trade through until normal closing time, close up then put your clocks back an hour.**

Similarly in six months time you will trade through until normal closing time, close up, and then put your clocks forward an hour.

This agreement was based on the 'swings and round-about' principle and has worked satisfactory thus far.

Application fees are payable on receipt of your application. Application renewals should be received at least 1 month prior to licences/certificates expiring. Special Licences should be received at least one month prior to the event/occasion as the Police have up to 20 working days in which to advise the District Licensing Agency of any objections.

## Permanent Liquor Ban

From the 24<sup>th</sup> of December 2002 the Wanganui District Council Permanent Liquor Ban came into force for the area defined in the plan below:

#### PERMANENT LIQUOR BAN – CENTRAL BUSINESS AREA

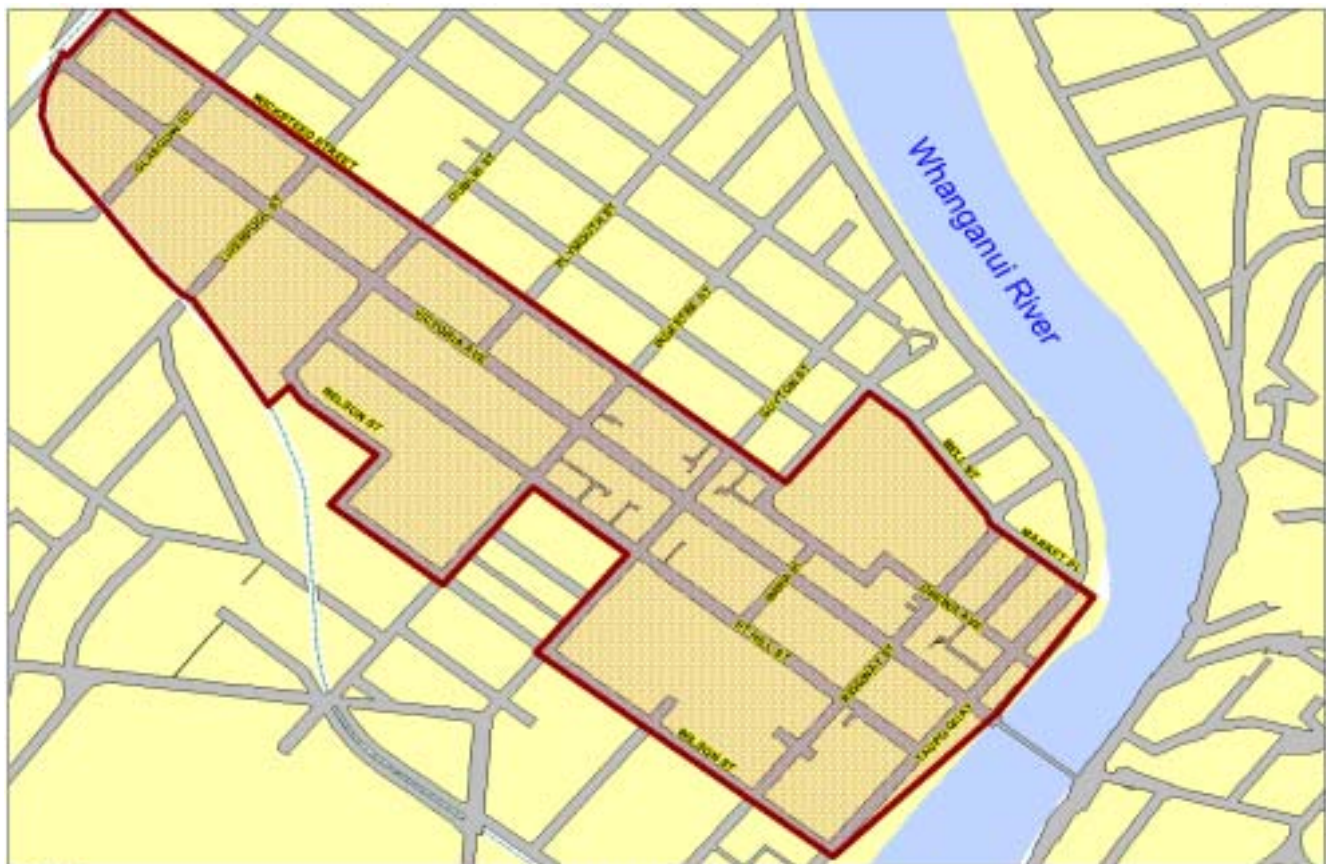
Public notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 709(F) of the Local Government Act 1974 that the Wanganui District Council at a Special Meeting on Monday, 9 December 2002, resolved:

To implement the proposed Permanent Liquor Ban, under Section 709C of the Local Government Act 1974, stipulating that:

- (i) The **consumption, bringing and possession of liquor** in a public place is prohibited on specified days, and
- (ii) The specified days are **Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week, 24 December, 26 December and 31 December, from 7.00pm to 7.00am the following day**, the time period starting on each specified day, and
- (iii) The Permanent Liquor Ban will be in force on public places as specified under Section 709B of the Local Government Act 1974, including:
  - A road, whether or not the road is under the control of a council; and
  - One or more parts of a public place

within the area defined on the map and described as all public places including streets, service lanes, lanes and footpaths, car-parks, parks and reserves within the area bounded by and including the Wanganui Town Bridge, Taupo Quay, Wilson Street, Guyton Street, St Hill Street, Ingestre Street, Wilson Street, Bassett Street, Nelson Street, Dublin Street, Castlecliff Branch Railway Line, London Street, Wicksteed Street, Cameron Terrace, Bell Street and Market Place.

**AND THAT** in accordance with Section 709(F)(3) of the Local Government Act 1974, **the Liquor Ban come into force on 24 December 2002**
