

## ▶ ME HE AMUAMU TÄU!

Me he amuamu e pä ana ki 'te hoihoi rawa atu' kua wāeatia mai, e tika kia haere te āpiha kia tirohia, kia rāngona mōna ake.

Mehemea kua tika te amuamu, kāore e kore ko te ki atu ia ki te tangata nōna te hē, kia whakaitingia e ia te hoihoi nei.

E tāea e te āpiha te tuku whakaatu atu ki te kaihara 'ā tuhi, ā korero', ā, e mana tonu atu ana ko tāua whakaatu mō te toru ra.

Ki te kore e rongo te kaihara ki te āpiha, ka noho marō kē, kei raro i te ture, e tika ana kia tomokia te whare e tāua āpiha me tētehi Pirihimana kia tangohia atu te pū ō taua hoihoi ra.

*If your stereo is seized by a Council Officer, you may not get it back. You must prove that your circumstances are special and that neighbours will not be effected. Provided you have sufficient evidence that the neighbours will not be affected, your stereo may be picked up from Environmental Services, Wanganui District Council Offices, 101 Guyton Street, Wanganui upon payment of \$120.00.*

All you need to know about Noise Control

## WHAT IS "EXCESSIVE NOISE" ?

The Resource Management Act 1991, Section 326 defines, "Excessive Noise" as any noise that is under human control and of such a nature as to unreasonably interfere with the peace, comfort and convenience of any person.



Common noise sources that may cause complaint are:

- 1 Noisy stereos and bands
- 2 Industrial appliances, including for example, refrigerator noise
- 3 Burglar alarms including house and car alarms
- 4 Barking Dogs

If you have problems with appliance noise or any repeated stereo or band noise problems you should contact an Environmental Health Officer. Such noise may require assessment in terms of the Noise Standards and ultimately the serving of an Abatement Notice.

In the case of burglar alarms, these should be installed within the building or should be connected to a security firm or the Police Station. External alarms may cause offence and exceed the noise standards contained in the District Plan.

An alarm may result in an officer having to gain access and causing damage to the building. If the alarm exceeds the District Plan Requirements the firm or person responsible may be served with an Infringement Notice.

## HE AHA 'TE HOIHOI RAWA ATU'?

E ki ana te ture, (*Resource Management Act 1991/326*) ko te hoihoi tēnei, ka puta mai i ngā mahi e **HE AHA 'TE HOIHOI RAWA ATU'?** whakamanahia e wai ra, ā, he mea whakararu atu ai i te aio 'ā noho', ā aha atu rānei.

### ĀNEI NGĀ PŪ MOMO HOIHOI NEI :

1. Ngā waerehe kaha hoihoi, peene rānei
2. Ngā mihini ahunui, pēnei i ngā pōuaka whakamakariri kai
3. Ngā pahū whānako 'ā whare ā waka'
4. Ngā kuri auau nōa iho nei.

Ki te whakararu koe i te kaha hoihoi ō ngā āhuatanga kua whakarārangihiā ki runga nei, waea atu ki tētahi ō ngā 'āpiha taiao' i tō rohe. Māna e whakarite atu, mehe-mea kua tika tō tono i runga i ngā whakaritenga o te 'Whakaatu Mauru'.

E tika ana hoki kia hono ngā pahū whānako nei, ki te Tari Pirihimana ki ngā Kamupene Kaitiaki i ngā rawa tangata.

Me mōhio mai, kō ngā pahū mō waho whare, e tāea te whakararu atu i te iwi, inā ka piki te kaha hoihoi ki tua ake i ngā taumata kua whakaaetia e te Māhere Kaunihera.

Ka tae pea te wā, hei whakakorea ngā pahū nei, ka tukitukia e te āpiha te tataui i tana tomokanga ki roto. Me i te kaha kē atu te pahū i tō te 'Whakaatu Mauru', e taea te tangata nōna te hē, te whāinatia.

### Barking Dogs:

It is an offence under the Dog Control Act 1996 for a dog to cause a nuisance by loud or persistent barking. If this occurs try and identify the property where the dog is barking by house number and street name and ring the Wanganui District Council Animal Control Department.



### 'Kuri Auau'

He hara tēnā i raro i te 'ture kuri' (*Dog Control Act 1996*) kia auau kino nei te kuri, kia whakararu atu ai i te iwi nui tonu. Ne ko koe tenei kei te whakararu, tuhia te nama o te whare, te tiriti rānei, ā, me wāea koe ki te Kaunihera ā Rohe ō Whanganui, arā ki te Tari o te Rōpu Tiaki Kararehe.

## IF A COMPLAINT IS RECEIVED ...

If a complaint is received by a Council Officer regarding excessive noise, the officer is required to investigate the complaint. If the officer is of the opinion that the noise is excessive, he/she may direct the person responsible for the noise, to turn the noise down to a reasonable level.

A direction may be given in writing or verbally to any person who appears responsible for the noise and can be in force for up to 72 hours.

If the noise is not turned down (or if the noise continues when the Officer leaves) that Officer (accompanied by a Police Officer) may enter the property and seize the instrument or appliance from which the noise is coming from.
